WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE AN ACTIVE LISTENER?

When a teacher or school helper or another student is addressing us

- 1. Put down everything in our hands and stop working
- 2. Turn to face the person speaking to us
- 3. Keep eye contact
- 4. Do not talk
- 5. Let the person know that we are listening through our non-verbal communication, e.g. nodding in agreement, smiling if appropriate
- 6.Be prepared to repeat back what the other person has said to us
