The Religious Life of the School, which is reflective of second dimension of the Religious Education - 'teaching people to be religious in a particular way' (Moran, 1991), provides a lens through which our school community at St Joseph's Tobruk Memorial can develop and enrich its religious life.

At St Joseph's Tobruk Memorial, we have a vibrant and engaging faith life. As a Catholic school, we aim to nurture and support all students and their families to connect and participate in the Catholic Christian tradition. We believe that Catholic schools are distinctive, where the Gospel values permeate our entire school program and where the

Good News is actively lived out in all parts of the community. We do this by strengthening the integration of faith, life and culture, inviting students to discover God's presence in their daily lives and engaging them in a dialogue between their life experiences and Catholic teaching.

The community of St Joseph's Tobruk Memorial, recognises and celebrates the diversity of our students, encouraging and supporting the development of a child's faith and spirituality through the Religious Life of the School as influenced by our co-founders St Joseph, St Mary of the Cross Mackillop, and the Rats of Tobruk.

At St Joseph's Tobruk Memorial, our goal is to build a faith-filled community, where all are inspired by the person and teachings of Jesus Christ to lead and serve in an inclusive community that works together to create a preferred and hope-filled future for today's generation and those to come.

The four interrelated components: Religious Identity and Culture; Evangelisation and Faith Formation; Prayer and Worship and Social Action and Justice provide an important focus for the development of the religious life of our school community.





Religious Identity & Culture

St Joseph's

Religious Identity and Culture at St Joseph's Tobruk Memorial is centred on the person of Jesus. Our challenge as a Catholic school is to translate the inspiration of Jesus into the real world. We also draw inspiration from the rich heritage and tradition of the Catholic Church. Here at St Joseph's Tobruk Memorial, the Josephite charism is central to our story and ethos. Our school is named 'St Joseph's Tobruk Memorial', a name given to reflect the co-founders of Monsignor Owen Steele, a Beenleigh Parish Priest and a Rat of Tobruk, and St Joseph, the patron of the Sisters of St Joseph who were entrusted with the education of children from the school's establishment. The school is inspired by the qualities and values of Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop and nurtures the Josephite charism within the school community. As a school community, we celebrate the Feast days of St Joseph and Mary MacKillop and teach about the charisms of Mary MacKillop and St Joseph. *Courage, Faith and Love* are evident in the lives and stories of St Joseph, Fr Owen Steele and Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop which significantly contribute to the founding history and traditions of the school. The school's core values of dignity, justice, compassion, camaraderie, courage, resilience, reconciliation and trust & faith in God are integrated into the purposeful and daily life of the community.

Evangelisation and Faith Formation occurs at St Joseph's Tobruk Memorial through both the Religious Life of the School and through the Religious Education Curriculum. Our mission is to serve and lead an inclusive faith-filled community that is inspired to be filled with hope creating a preferred future. This ongoing mission is grounded in the Good News of Jesus and is involves each member of our community, staff, students, parents and parishioners. We proclaim the Good News through living out the Gospel values and by listening to and reflecting upon the Word of God, allowing it to change our heart by engaging with the world like Jesus did.

Prayer & Worship

Prayer and Worship allows all in our community to celebrate our lives and identity as members of the Church. Prayer and worship nourish the spiritual growth of all members and this is a part of our daily practice. It is also crucial that we all engage in a wide variety of prayer experiences that can nurture our relationship with God and with others. At St Joseph's Tobruk Memorial, this occurs through Mass and Liturgy of the Word, class prayer, music, meditation, and individual prayer. It is also important for students to come to know and understand the formal traditions of the church to allow them to participate and engage in the life of the church and religious life of the school more fully.

At St Joseph's Tobruk Memorial, we demonstrate this through:

- Daily Prayer in classrooms
- Information regarding school patrons and significant figures are visible on walls of the Sr Jenny Centre
- School song is an important part of school gatherings
- Staff members gather and lead for prayer every Friday morning
- Special life moments are celebrated and include prayer for staff
- School calendar prioritises school feast days and liturgical celebrations
- Class prayer spaces are well resourced with liturgical colours and symbols and are updated each year
- APRE joins teachers for classroom prayer
- Parish Priest blesses each sacred space and classroom at the beginning of each year
- Each class has an opportunity once a semester to lead a prayer assembly, liturgy of the word and Class Mass
- Use of the arts to enhance prayer movement, dance and drama in liturgical celebrations
- Induction of year 6 leaders at Leadership Mass with pledge, blessing and badges
- Parents /carers and wider community invited to be part of the school's prayer life
- Prayer resources in sways/powerpoints are sent to classes for significant days
- Sacred spaces in classrooms, staffroom, front office that reflect liturgical season or significant days
- School Celebrations: Opening Year School Mass, St Joseph's Feast Day School Mass, Ash Wednesday Liturgy, Stations of the Cross, Easter Liturgy, ANZAC Day Assembly, Mother's Day Assembly, Father's Day Assembly, Sorry day Assembly, Catholic education Week Parish School Mass, Grandparent's Day Assembly, Harmony Day Liturgy, World Teacher's Day Liturgy, Year 6 Graduation Liturgy & Awards, End of Year Thanksgiving Liturgy, NAIDOC Day Liturgy
